Hello, everyone, and welcome to the daily water update for February the 8th, I'm Capt. Darren Guenther, chief of staff for Navy Region, Hawaii. As our work to restore water to your homes continues, we're approaching yet another milestone. Among the next steps is an amended health advisory neighborhood by neighborhood to declare the water in your homes fit for human consumption.

We know you probably have a lot of questions on this step, so we've asked Capt. Mike Meno on. He's an engineer with Naval Facilities Systems Engineering Command and also a member of the Inter-agency Drinking Water Team.

He'll address some of those questions and talk about this very important next step. First, let's take a look at our map, in the progress we've made there. First of all, our latest and greatest updated chart here is posted on our water website.

That's [navy.mil/jointbasewater](http://navy.mil/jointbasewater), so our neighborhoods of 19 neighborhoods, 18 of them are striped blue, indicating we have completed all flushing in those neighborhoods, both system drinking water as well as facilities and home drinking water and we have one more zone here at Iroquois Point.

That's Kapilina Beach Homes. We have completed the two schools in that neighborhood. We've completed all of the facilities, buildings in that neighborhood and we are waiting on guests.

It looks like 46 homes to go out of 1459, so we're going to complete that neighborhood flush today.
