

Civilians & DOD-affiliated personnel and their dependents affected by the Navy Water Distribution System contamination can take a health survey and be entered into an exposure registry. The survey and registry are separate efforts to understand and track health concerns.

DOH & CDC Health Survey

- Civilians & DOD-affiliated individuals who have been in areas served by the JBPHH water system since November 20, 2021 can participate in the Hawaii Department of Health and Centers for Disease Control health survey.
- People who live, work, visit, or attend school/daycare in the area may participate.
- Participation is voluntary and confidential. Results will be shared with the public.
- The survey will be available online until February 7, 2022.

- No action is required by members of the community to join this registry.
- Non-residents who only briefly visited or stayed in one of the impacted areas, and may not be reflected on resident or employee rosters, may self-report at the number below
- The registry will be updated with additional incident details as more information is obtained over time.
